More discovered on William White

Sue Allan, our intrepid English friend, has once again expanded the periphery of our ignorance regarding our Society's namesake. Working with her colleagues Caleb Johnson and Simon Neal, they discovered William White, and his half-siblings Henry and Jacomine May, were excommunicated! They also established William was a shoemaker. The New England Historical Genealogical Society published their findings in their spring issue of the *Register*.

Sue and company have established William White was baptized at Wisbech, Cambridgeshire on January 25, 1586/7. He is the son of Edward and Thomasine (Cross) (May) White. His mother, Thomasine, had been previously married to John May, and by him they had two children, Henry and Jacomine May — William White's half- siblings.

While searching the records of the Diocese of Ely, Cambridgeshire, Sue discovered William and his siblings had been excommunicated. The record, following below, show that Henry and his

sister Jacomine May, and William White, shoemaker, were cited for non- conformity.

Henry and Jacomine May were cited for separating themselves from the congregation and "pretending to joyne themselves to a reformed Churche in Amsterdam," while William White was cited for being "negligent in coming to divine service" and for being a "favourer of the sort of the Brownists."

The citations were all made on 16 March 1607/8. This was followed by the proclamations being posted to the church door during divine services on 3 April 1608. When the Mays and William White did not appear, a suspension was announced during the church services on 17 April 1608. On 4 June 1608, the excommunications were formally issued by the church, and were announced at divine services on 19 June 1608.

William White arrived in Amsterdam in May 1608, even before his formal excommunication had been issued and announced. Henry May — and presumably his sister Jacomine, and his children, including Dorothy — arrived in Amsterdam in August 1608. There they all joined with the Ancient Brethren Church; when the congregation split shortly thereafter, they followed Henry Ainsworth. On 5 May 1609, Jacomine May married in Amsterdam, printer Jan l'Ecluse, with her half-brother William White accompanying her.

At Wisbech St. Peters Wee present

Henry Maye and Jacomyn Maye his sister for that they have separated themselves from our Congregac[i]on, pretending to joyne themselves to a reformed Churche in Amstelredam in the Lowe Countryes.

And 16th March 1607[/8] from the original citation gained by William Oldcorne, apparitor, [...] they did not appear by ways and means, etc, on

Saturday the 9th day of April next at Cambridge.



And on 9th April 1608, the aforesaid decree having been exhibited to William Oldcorne, apparitor, the aforesaid decree was executed by the affixing of the same upon the door of the parish church of Wisbech St Peter on Sunday at the time of divine service. 3 April 1608, etc, not appearing, a publication of suspension issued. And the letters of the aforesaid suspension were announced in the church there at the time of divine services on Sunday 17th April 1608 by Master Matthew Champion, clerk, vicar there, just as appears.


And 4th June 1608, with their contumacy increasing, there issued an excommunication. And letters of the aforesaid excommunication were announced in the church there at the time of divine services on the 19th of June 1608 by master Matthew Champion, clerk, vicar there, just as appears. Jachomyn Maye presented, as above. And 16th March 1607[/8] the original citation, having been exhibited by William Oldcorne, the apparitor, was cited. Not appearing, there issued a suspension. And letters of the aforesaid suspension were announced similarly, as above. And on the 4th of June 1608, her aforesaid contumacy increasing, there was issued an excommunication. And letters of the

aforesaid excommunication were announced similarly, as above.

At Wisbech St. Peters

William White, shoemaker, presented for that he is negligent in coming to divine service. And on 16th March 1607[/8] the original citation having been exhibited by William Oldcorne, apparitor, proclamation, not appearing by ways and means, etc, until Saturday the 9th day of April next at Cambridge.

And on 9th April 1608, the aforesaid decree having been exhibited by William Oldcorne, apparitor, the aforesaid decree




was executed by the affixing of the same upon the door of the parish church there on 3 April 1608, etc.

With him not appearing, a suspension issued. And the letters of the aforesaid suspension were announced in the church there at the time of divine services on Sunday 17th April 1608 by Master Matthew Champion, clerk, vicar there, just as appears.

And 4th June 1608, with his contumacy increasing, there issued an excommunication. And letters of the aforesaid excommunication were announced in the church there at the time of divine services on the 19th of June 1608 by master Matthew Champion, clerk, vicar there, just as appears. The said William White presented for that he is suspected to be a favourer of the sort of the Brownists. And 16 Mar 1607[/8], the original citation having been exhibited by William Oldcorne, the apparitor, proclamation, not appearing by ways and means, etc, until Saturday the 9th of April next at Cambridge. And on 9th April 1608, the aforesaid decree having been exhibited


by William Oldcorne, apparitor, the aforesaid proclamation was executed, as above. With him not appearing, a suspension was issued. And the letters of the aforesaid [suspension] were announced similarly, as above. And 4th June 1608, with his contumacy increasing, there issued an excommunication. And letters of the aforesaid excommunication were announced similarly, just as appears.

Below is the floor plan to St. Peter's--the excommunication would have been posted on the Porch Door, which is on the lower left side.



The Last Pilgrim A review by Cousin Mike Beard

This book is worth reading.



The cover attracted my attention (yes, I judged the book by its cover). Just look at it. The picture is worth a thousand words. The Last Pilgrim is Mary Allerton Cushman, who was four when she sailed on the Mayflower and 83 when she passed into history as the last

survivor of those who founded Plimoth.

I bought the book for my 14-year old granddaughter, Megan Wells, and asked the author, Noelle Granger to sign it for her. Noelle warned me her book contained adult themes, so I decided I better read it first. Good move. I gave it to Megan (pictured left)



immediately, as this is a narrative every pilgrim descendant should read.

Looking Back

Dear Cousins and Friends, the internet, the web and I are not always friends. But on rare occasions something almost miraculous happens. I received an email from Julia Ranford Bright referencing a letter written by Anna White in 1850 and some articles that I had written. She realized that Anna was part of our family and her letter should be returned to us. She sent the letter as a gift. I will donate it to either Pilgrim Hall or GSMD along with my articles in the 2013 and 2014 Newsletters to provide context. I am reprinting these earlier articles with

some edits to provide that same context for us.

It is hard to believe that a simple question, "Does the Peregrine White House still exist?" would open up such a world of forgotten 18th and 19th century cousins. It has meandered through reflections on the lives and politics of our ancestors and cousins. Now we return to the Whites who lived in Peregrine's house. Based on the History of Marshfield (HM), Abijah White bought the house from his uncle Joseph, who had moved to Lebanon, CT. Abijah was the son of John and Susanna Sherman White and born on 8 Oct 1706. John was the son of Daniel and Hannah Hunt and grandson of Peregrine. John died as a Tory refugee on 29 Oct 1775 in Boston and was buried at King's Chapel. His family divided the property among themselves. (William White Family {WWF}, v 13 p 131) His wife Anna Little died at Peregrine's House (HM) on 11 Mar 1791. (WWF, p. 131) Their son William owned the house on his mother's death. (HM) William was born on 9 August 1752. (WWF, p 131) William had three children: John, Anna, and Sybil. With these three children, we move to a sad part of the history.

John, Anna and Sybil lived in their ancestral home on their ancestral lands among many cousins and friends. Something happened to John and Anna that caused them to be sent to the new Lunatic Hospital in Worchester. While I had never heard of Cousin John and Cousin Sybil, I am outraged that their stories in the records of the Asylum were sold on eBay. The remainder of this article is quoted from the eBay listing on 6 July 2008 but is edited for clarity.

Very interesting archive of (18 pieces), consisting of a legal document and the remainder are letters all relating to John A White, and his sister Anna White, who were both patients at the "Lunatic Hospital," Worchester, MA, dating from 1841-1870.

While Anna only mentioned briefly, John appears to have been in and out of the hospital a number of times over the years.

[Sep 7 1841; document re: bequest to John A. White and his sister Sybil White]

Two-page legal paper, dated Plymouth MA Sep 7 1841, by John A White, who was "yeoman", or owner of a small farm, and his sister Sybil White of Marshfield MA, appoint John Ford, also of Marshfield, as their attorney to handle the bequest of farm land to them from Cynthia Little and Elizabeth Baxter of Lebanon, Connecticut.

[Letter, State Lunatic Hospital, Nov 3 1843 from S.B. Woodward, to Sybil White, Marshfield]

"your brother John. ... appears better than he has done ... except for his anxiety to get home. He has appeared better this time than before. Has uniformly [permission] to go where he chooses. Some influences ... which have not before been noticed, have been the principle subject of our attention this time.... He says since I have cautioned him & he has as far as practicable followed my advice, he has had better feelings in his heard (sic) than he has had for a long time. Had he not better come home on trial, or be dis- charged?" Both he and Anna [his sister] attended our first Ball last evening

[signed S.B. Woodward]

[There follows a one-page letter on the same paper from the patient, John A White, to sister Sybil, dated the previous day. In it he writes,]

"my health is better than it has been for number of years past. I was much pleased to hear from you, but regret that you have to live ther (sic) alone Dr. Woodward, I believe, has consented for me to return home, when he has seen the trustees and when you will be glad to see me ... I must inquire in regard to the stage, but I believe I can my way home any time I get a discharge ... [signed] John A. White." Faint red Worcester postmark.

[Three-page letter, dated Hospital, Worcester, Jun 25 1844, from Anna White, to Sybil]

> "Dr. Woodward returned on 16 of July. We have heard from Theda several times since she left I believe she like her situation very well ... I suppose you would like to know how I employ myself I was some of my own clothes and iron some and set the set table and help turn out the tea and coffee ... read some newspapers. I have not walk much of late, on account of the pain in my ankles. I should suppose that it would (be) much pleasanter for you now [that] you have a family in the house. I should like to have you send me some white woolen yarn and some swamp huckleberries ... Rufus ... should talk with you respecting my coming home. He did not see the doctor, Woodward, for he was quite sick that day, but is much better now. [signed] Anna White "

[One-page letter, dated Hospital Worcester, Aug 14 1845, to Sybil]

'Dr. Woodward has given his consent for me to return home & presume you and the rest of my friends will be glad

... and go about my business as usual. We thought it would best to consult you before I came home. I can see by the pares that the stages meet the Hingham steamboat. I shall want to come down with Mr. Jones and stop at the nearest place, which will be at Mr. Keen's ... [signed] John A White. Dr. Woodward adds a short note to John's letter, "Your brother has appeared well since the first few days of July. I do not know when he can go home better than present. I always feel anxiety about him, lest he should have a turn of excitement while a broad about the Hospital or at home ... [signed S.B. Woodward."

[Hospital, Worcester, Jul 15 1847, John to Sybil]

"my health continues good, and I see no reason why I cannot return home soon. Miss Elizabeth Lewis called the day you left ... with Benjamin Lewis's wife. They were in to see [sister] Anna, and was a short time. I believe Anna's health continues to improve. I have bought the ... (End of transcripted copy.)

I am now including the newly transcribed letter from Anna. Again, I want to thank Julia Bright for her gift to the Pilgrim William White Society. Her letter was written February 29, 1849. John was home by that date.

Worcester February 29, 1849

Dear Brother,

I would inform you that my health is quite good. Wrote to Sybil on the 25 of January but have not received any answer to my letter. Mr. Billings has Sick with the Rheumatism Since you left here but he is much better You

have I suppose read the death of Elizabeth Allen and the LoFs of the Method Meeting house by fire. I think I shall Make you a visit in the spring I wrote to Sybil that should like to have some of your viratans (?) Apples We have plenty of apples here but I would like to have a few of yours when it is convenient for you to send them I wish you to write me if you have called to see the Deaf Shoemaker since your return to Marshfield they are drawing to build the addition to the Hospital, you may M (scratched out) tell Sibil that I have worn my new drefs several times I wish you to ask Sibel to send me a small piece of her new cloak as I see w (scratched out) see the color of it I hope you or Sibil will write to soon unlefs Sickness should prevent give my respects to Mifs Catherine Land Mifs F Clapp

from your Sister Anna White

We have gotten to know John, Anna and Sybil. Anna and John spent most of their lives in and out of the new hospital for the mentally ill. Sybil struggled farming Peregrine's lands as best she could. She sold butter and cheese. She kept the farm stocked with sheep, cattle and horses. After she sold Peregrine's farm, she moved to a nearby home. (*HM*, p. 135)

When faced with her own failing health, she advertised to locate the descendants of another brother who had moved away. Finally, among all the respondents to her inquiries was Ashton White. Mr. White was able to establish his identity and descent. He inherited her estate. She had left the interest on \$800 to the selectmen of Marshfield to assist "worthy and destitute spinsters." (*HM*, p. 15)

Unfortunately, a link to an early record of a visit to Sybil's home is no longer active. The description was of her sitting with a visitor in her quiet home listening to the ticking of the clock in the home of her ancestors. This was the picture I wanted to close with — Sybil's sitting contentedly in her home being the last White to live in Peregrine's house but being happy.

African Traditional Religion has a core belief that our ancestors are always with us. However, as we lose details about the person, the person becomes fainter and fainter and has less and less influence on our lives. I hope that this revised article has given more detail to our White ancestors and brought them more to life. Thank you, Anna, John and Sybil.



The Descendant Report

I am creating a database of members' lineages and would love to include your line. If you are willing to send me a copy of your approved Mayflower Society application, I will include it in the database (dvytca@gmail.com)

Below is a report that uses a descendant-ordered format starting with an ancestor (Pilgrim William White) and moving forward in time to that individual's descendants. His first-born child is #2, Resolved White and William's second born child is #3, Peregrine White. By locating person #2, Resolved White, you can find his descendants listed beneath his entry; #4 Samuel White, etc. To find #4's descendants, go to generation #3 and you will find person #4.

This introductory report ends with generation #3. To see a full 14 generation report which probably includes your line to Pilgrim William White, sign into the Member's Page on The Pilgrim William White website. You will meet some cousins you didn't know you had.


